Purpose

The primary purpose of the Perpetrator Disruption task and finish group is to ensure strategic oversight of the delivery plan - Focus on disrupting perpetrators targeting adults at risk using intelligence to identify, intervene, divert and support vulnerable victims through a cohesive partnership.

Objectives

- To collect data to analyse prevalence and identify trends, themes and 'hot spots' in order to safeguard adults at risk
- To develop a multi-agency response by identifying and disrupting perpetrators targeting adults at risk to minimise the duration and impact of abuse being experienced by victims
- To implement proactive and effective disruption tactics in order to target those perpetrators currently posing/causing the most harm to adults at risk
- To support, safeguard and manage risk with victims and their families most at risk
- To ensure that Making Safeguarding Personal and Contextual Safeguarding are embedded in policy and practice
- To ensure that best practice and learnings from SARs as relevant is included in the development of the outcomes from the workstream.

Chair

The Chair will be District Commander (Essex Police).

Membership

Members may nominate a deputy, providing they have sufficient seniority and subject knowledge to make decisions on behalf of their organisation.
