Public Engagements and Events



During this year's National Safeguarding Adults Week (15 to 21 November), the Southend, Essex and Thurrock (SET) Safeguarding Adults Board encouraged residents to improve their understanding of some of the big adult safeguarding issues that agencies tackle locally.

This year the SET Boards promoted and highlighted information on where people can access help and support for themselves, family members and friends who may be experiencing abuse. Over the week, safeguarding adults explored with a social media campaign particular issues seen within our Southend, Essex and Thurrock communities each day, including Modern Slavery, Cuckooing, Hate Crime, PREVENT and Domestic Abuse.

On Wednesday 18 November, TSAB, alongside a number of partners (Thurrock Council – Environmental and community Protection, Community Safety Partnership, Essex Police, Essex County Fire and Rescue and Thurrock Lifestyle Solutions), had a pop up stand in Grays High Street raising awareness of Hate Crime and how we all play a role in safeguarding the vulnerable people in our community.





The uptake of our training sessions have been overwhelming, with many sessions filling up within a few days.
