Our recent social media posts have been concentrating on <u>Mate Crime</u> and how to spot the signs. A 3-minute animation called <u>'Tricky Friends'</u> has been developed to help reduce the risk of harm and exploitation in groups who may be less able to recognise the intentions of others.
