What is hate crime?

Hate crime is when someone commits a crime, or picks on a person, just because of who they are. Someone may be bullied because of their:



Disability

This could be because of your physical disability, learning difficulty, are Deaf or Blind, or have a mental health condition.



Race

This could be because of where you come from, your skin colour or the language you speak.



Religion

This could be because of your faith, religion, belief or if you have no belief.

What is hate crime?



Sex or Gender

This could be because you are a boy or a girl.



Sexual Orientation

This could be because of who you are going out with or who you are in love with.



Transgender

This could be because of your gender identity.

What might hate crime look like?

Hate crime can involve different people and how they treat you or speak to you. It could be a stranger, or someone you know.



They may call you horrible names, bully you or be rude to you.



They may take or damage your property or things.



They may hit, kick, spit or throw things at you. They may threaten to harm you, your family, or friends.



They may touch parts of your body when you don't want them to.

What to do about hate crime?



Go somewhere safe as soon as you can.

Tell someone you trust what has happened and ask them to help you.



You could tell:

A family member, trusted friend. A social worker, support worker or key worker.



A teacher, a tutor, a doctor or nurse, or someone you work with.



A person from your community or faith group. Or an advocate, who is someone who makes sure people listen to you.

What to do about hate crime?

Hate crime can often start with something small, an incident. This can become bigger and more serious. Report it before this happens.



A person you trust can help you write down what has happened.



They can help to take photos, or record you saying what has happened.

Report to the Police:

In an emergency, call **999**. Otherwise, call **101**. You can go to a Police station

What happens if you tell the police?

If you tell the police about hate crime, they can do something about it.



A police officer may need to speak to you. You can ask a person you trust to support you.



The police will ask you questions about what has happened.



The police will advise and support you with the next steps.
